



RENEE'S REMINDERS TENANT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

In an effort to maintain a five-star reputation, the owners of Homestead Run and the Business Office will be publishing a series of reminders and modifications to standard lease, rules, and regulations. This column will be called Renee's Reminders, and Renee means business!

🕨 Over the weekend, while standing outside my home, I saw the fluffy black cat, the smooth black cat, the gray cat, the calico cat. Whose cats are these? Anyone that knows me knows I'm not a big fan of cats, although I'd never want to see any of them hurt (nor would I hurt them myself). My gripe is not just about feeding them (which is not allowed), it's the fact that owners just let them out. The office gets the phone call that there are cats wandering around with collars which tells me they are owned by someone. When we talk about hiring a trapper, we're the bad guys. We are extremely limited to when, where, and how long we are allowed to keep a trap out. Those that work for rescue organizations in the park are not responsible for capturing your wandering cats and finding their home. It's hard enough trying to keep the dog crap under control, and the cats just roam freely in the park. If you're a pet owner, be a responsible one.

- Let's talk about your crap. Bulk pick-up from Public Works does not automatically pick up your stuff if they're in the community. It is your responsibility to call 732-255-1000 and listen to the prompts. It's not our responsibility to call for you, nor is it our responsibility to call for you, nor is it our responsibility to pick it up. As per the township, piles should only be 4x4. They will not take your appliances or electronics. Neither will we.
- 🍗 There's important reminder an regarding selling your home. You have three options - for sale by owner, through a realtor, or through the Homestead Run Office. No matter what you choose, the closing must take place at the clubhouse only after potential buyer vour has been approved by the office. Those selling on their own or through a realtor MUST notify the office prior to listing. Realtors must sign agreements. To complete a sale, sewer must be paid. Rent must be current. Lot must be clean, and no one signs the title until they're at the closing table. As always, if you have any questions, give us a call.

I felt like I had truly let myself down, and for a long period of time, I beat myself up. I became my own worst enemy. Recently, I was talking with a friend about being the book judged by its cover. She reminded me that my cover was fantastic, but it was my pages that counted more than anything. I needed to hear that. My pages are filled with amazing experiences. My pages are filled with loving friends that I have adopted as family. They're also filled with struggle, strife, with being able to overcome certain challenges I never thought I could. There's more relevance in that than any judgment that comes from the close minded.

I refuse to let the opinion of others dictate how I feel about myself, and this, Homestead, is my reminder for you to do the same. 



CAPRESE CHICKEN

INGREDIENTS


- 4 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil
- Juice of 1 lemon, divided
- Salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tsp. Italian seasoning or dried oregano
- 4 boneless skinless antibiotic free chicken breasts, pounded to even thickness

INSTRUCTIONS

- In a small bowl, combine oil, half the lemon juice, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper, and Italian seasoning (or oregano) and whisk to combine. Transfer to a large re-sealable bag along with chicken; seal and refrigerate for 30 minutes.
- Heat grill over medium-high then add chicken, discarding excess marinade. Grill until charred and cooked to an internal temperature of 155°-160°, about 5 to 7 minutes per side.
- Meanwhile, combine tomatoes, garlic, basil, and remaining lemon juice, and season with salt and pepper. While chicken is still on grill, top each breast with 1 slice mozzarella and cover until cheese is melted, 2 to 3 minutes. Top chicken with tomato mixture.
- 4. Garnish with Parmesan and serve.

- 3 slicing tomatoes, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tbsp. freshly chopped basil
- 4 slices mozzarella
- Freshly grated Parmesan, for serving
