
Life's Canvas

### INGREDIENTS

- 3 pounds Potatoes (peeled and diced)
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup Cider Vinegar
- 2 teaspoons White Sugar
- 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoons Dry Mustard
- 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoons Salt
- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon Black Pepper (ground)
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup Mayonnaise
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup Sour Cream
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup Heavy Cream
- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup Onion (chopped)
- 3 Hard-Cooked Eggs (peeled and chopped)

### **INSTRUCTIONS**

1. Mix all ingredients together and serve cold or at room temperature.
