RENEE'S REMINDERS

In an effort to maintain a five-star reputation, the owners of Homestead Run and the Business Office will be publishing a series of reminders and modifications to standard lease, rules, and regulations. This column will be called Renee's Reminders, and Renee means business!

- This is a 55+ community. Any occupant must be a minimum of 42 years old. If you decide to add an occupant to your home, they must register at the Business Office. Underaged occupants are a violation of your lease and can lead to eviction.
- Any live-in assistants or caregivers must be licensed and insured. This includes family members. A letter from a licensed medical professional citing the need for in home care must be submitted. The caregiver is not considered a tenant and must move out when their services are no longer needed.
- Homes are owner-occupied. You may not sub-lease.
- Failure to comply will be deemed a violation and may result in eviction.
- Remember you are the owner. If you fail to comply with the rules and regulations, you will be the one evicted.

	RICK'S DAY RD SCRAMBLE!
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RENEE STANZIONE'S ST. PATRICK'S DAY IRISH COLCANNON

INGREDIENTS

- $2\frac{1}{2}$ pounds potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 4 slices bacon (can substitute with cooked peas and carrots)
- ¹/₂ small head cabbage, chopped (can substitute with spinach)
- 1 large onion, chopped
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk
- salt and pepper to taste
- ¹/₄ cup butter, melted

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Place potatoes in a saucepan with enough water to cover. Bring to a boil, and cook for 15 to 20 minutes, until tender.
- 2. Place bacon in a large, deep skillet. Cook over medium high heat until evenly brown. Drain, reserving drippings, crumble and set aside. In the reserved drippings, saute the cabbage and onion until soft and translucent. Putting a lid on the pan helps the vegetables cook faster.
- 3. Drain the cooked potatoes, mash with milk and season with salt and pepper. Fold in the bacon, cabbage, and onions, then transfer the mixture to a large serving bowl. Make a well in the center, and pour in the melted butter. Serve immediately.

INGREDIENTS

- 3 large scoops vanilla ice cream (about 1/4 cup each)
- 1/4 cup heavy cream
- 1/2 tsp. peppermint extract
- 6 drops green food coloring
- Whipped cream, for topping
- Maraschino cherry, for topping

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. In a blender, mix vanilla ice cream, heavy cream, peppermint extract, and food coloring until completely smooth, then pour into a glass.
- 2. Top with whipped cream and a cherry before serving.

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
