# ANNUAL **THANKSGIVING BAKE SALE**

Well, people, the changes are a'comin'. The following will highlight the most prominent changes that will be in the new lease as of December 1st. Everyone must sign a new lease. Signing procedures are to come.

- 1. Enough is enough. NO OCCUPANT SHOULD BE UNREGISTERED (or under 42 years old). There have been far too many people ignoring this rule. Unregistered occupants can result in eviction. If they're living in your home, they must be registered at the office. No exceptions. This includes live-in caretakers, who must supply a letter from a licensed medical professional detailing the need for live-in care. The caretaker is not a tenant and must move out when they are no longer needed. Live-in caretakers must also be licensed and insured.
- 2. A \$50.00 charge will be applied for late rent payments (more than 15 days past due) and/or bounced checks. A two-month rent delinquency will result in your file being sent to the attorney and possible eviction proceedings. We don't want your house, and we don't want to go to court but you can't live anywhere for free.
- 3. If you're going to sell your home, you must notify the office. All prospective tenants must be approved through the National Tenant Network. (Application can be found on homesteadrun.com or at the office.) All closings must take place at the clubhouse and be coordinated with the Business Office. This includes for sale by owners and realtors. No one is to sign over a title prior to closing.

- 4. If you own a dog or cat, make sure it's insured. Besides the certificate of insurance covering the animal, the office needs to see a license and proof of rabies vaccine. Other people's lots are not your dog's toilet. You will get one warning to keep your dog off of people's properties, after which you will get a dog violation fee. Continued violations may result in a revocation of animal privileges.
- 5. All those lots that are filled with STUFF (and you know who you are, because you've received a zillion letters), have 24 hours after notification to remove the STUFF. Should you choose not to remove the STUFF, a maintenance fee will be applied to your account. We will remove the STUFF for you. Keep your lots clean.
- 6. Let's talk about cars. The pool parking lot and your driveway are not used car lots. If it's not street worthy (insured, registered, and running), get it out of here or it will be towed at your expense. All work vehicles (tow, dump, equipment or horse trailers, buses) are prohibited within the park. You will get one written warning and one written warning only. After that, you will be charged a violation removal fee.

Sounds like we're getting tough, but these changes are based on continuous complaints from the homeowners and observances by the owners themselves. We are proud of where we live, and we hope everyone else feels that way, too!

#### CLASSIC TRADITIONAL THANKSGIVING STUFFING

This is that perfect stuffing that makes Thanksgiving feel like Thanksgiving.

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 3/4 cup (1 1/2 sticks) unsalted butter
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 cups chopped celery
- 1 loaf (18 to 20 ounce) brioche, challah or other egg bread (or use a country white bread), cut into 1-inch cubes (10 to 12 cups; see Note about drying bread)
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh sage or 1 teaspoon dried
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh marjoram or 1 teaspoon dried
- ½ cup chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- ½ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 2 large eggs
- 2 cups chicken or vegetable broth, preferably low sodium, or more as needed

#### INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- 2. Melt the butter in a medium skillet over medium heat. Add the onion and celery and cook, stirring occasionally for about 6 minutes until the vegetables are slightly golden and tender.
- 3. Remove the onion and celery from the heat and turn into the bowl. Add the dried bread cubes (see Note!), sage, marjoram, parsley, salt and pepper and toss to combine well. In another small bowl, beat the eggs with 2 cups of the broth (use vegetable broth for a vegetarian stuffing). Drizzle over the broth mixture and toss so that everything is moistened. You may need to add another ½ cup broth or so, if the mixture seems to be dry in a lot of spots. It should not feel soaked at all.
- 4. Turn the mixture into a 2 ½ to 3-quart baking dish or a 13×9 inch baking dish. Cover the stuffing with foil and bake for 40 minutes. Uncover the stuffing and continue to bake for another 45 minutes or so until the top is slightly crusty and golden brown.


