SIMPLE TACO LOVE

A taco recipe to make and eat from a heart shaped box or dish. More to love this Valentine's Day on Taco Tuesday!!!!!

INGREDIENTS

- 1 pound lean (at least 80%) ground beef
- 1 cup Old El PasoTM Thick 'n Chunky salsa
- 10 Old El PasoTM taco shells
- 1/2 head lettuce, shredded
- 1 medium tomato, chopped (3/4 cup)
- 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese (4 ounces)

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Cook beef in 10-inch skillet over medium heat 8 to 10 minutes, stirring occasionally, until brown; drain.
- 2. Stir salsa into beef. Heat to boiling, stirring constantly; reduce heat to medium-low. Cook 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Pour beef mixture into large serving bowl.
- 3. Heat taco shells as directed on package. Serve taco shells with beef mixture, lettuce, tomato and cheese.
- 4. chicken back to the pot. Stir over low heat until combined and warm. Serve with sesame seeds or chopped scallions + enjoy!


