

In an effort to maintain a five-star reputation, the owners of Homestead Run and the Business Office will be publishing a series of reminders and modifications to standard lease, rules, and regulations. This column will be called Renee's Reminders, and Renee means business!

- The owners of Homestead Run have upgraded your pool from chlorinated to salt water! Salt water pools have a lot of benefits for your joints, allergies, and skin. Make sure your badges are up to date (title and current homeowner's insurance to the Business Office), and make sure your account is in good standing. Contact the Business Office if you need to make arrangements to lower your arrears. We want all residents to be able to enjoy our awesome amenities.
- At the pool, we will have new tables and chairs. Please have some consideration for the new furniture as it will have to be used by many.
- When you're at the pool, be nice to your neighbors. We're too old for gossip, so cut it out. Mind your business and stop bullying!
- Our game room has been remodeled and cleaned up. We want it to stay that way! Be courteous. Clean up after yourself. There is NO smoking in the game room or inside the premises at ANY time under ANY circumstances. Do not eat or drink around the game tables. Our old ones were used and abused. 

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## ITALIAN STYLE PORK ROAST

### Submitted by: Renee Stanzione

Spoil dad on Father's Day with this delicious Italian-style roast pork. Can be served with a side of mashed potatoes, pasta, broccoli or dad's favorite side dish.

Happy Father's Day.

### **INGREDIENTS**

- 3 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- 3 bay leaves, roughly chopped
- 1 tsp black peppercorn
- 2 tsp sea salt
- 1 ½ tbsp fennel seed
- 2 ½ tbsp olive oil
- 1.8kg rolled pork loin, untied with the skin scored
- 1 onion, cut into wedges
- 1 lemon, cut into wedges


### For the gravy

- 2 tbsp plain flour
- 125ml Marsala or red wine
- 500ml vegetable or chicken stock



### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Pound the garlic, bay, pepper, 1 tsp sea salt and 1 tbsp of the fennel seeds using a pestle and mortar, then stir in 1 tbsp oil. Place the pork, skin-side up, in a clean sink and pour over a kettleful of boiling water (this tightens the skin the first step towards great crackling). Drain, pat dry and place, skin-side down, on a chopping board. Rub the garlicky paste all over it, then roll up the loin and tie it at intervals with kitchen string. Arrange the onion and lemon in the center of a roasting pan and sit the pork on top, skin-side up. Rub the rind with the remaining salt and leave at room temperature, uncovered, for 1 hr.
- 2. Heat oven to 450. Rub the skin of the pork with the remaining oil. Lightly crush the remaining fennel seeds and scatter over the meat. Roast for 30 mins, then turn the heat down to 350 and continue to roast for 1 hr 20 mins. Remove the pork, cover loosely and leave to rest for 30 mins. If your crackling isn't crisp, pop the joint under a hot grill for a few mins, but watch it as it will burn very easily.
- 3. Meanwhile, make the gravy. Tip away all but 1 tbsp of fat from the tin and put on the hob. Add the flour and mix with the onion and lemon, scraping any bits from the bottom. Pour in the Marsala and let it bubble, then gradually add the stock and any of the resting juices, and simmer gently for 8-10 mins. Season, if needed, and strain through a sieve before serving.

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
