RENEE'S REMINDERS TENANT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

In an effort to maintain a five-star reputation, the owners of Homestead Run and the Business Office will be publishing a series of reminders and modifications to standard lease, rules, and regulations. This column will be called Renee's Reminders, and Renee means business!

- Something positive to start with. We have renovated our conference room, increased its size, added audio and video, and have arranged for a Speaker Series beginning this month. Check the newsletter and the mailroom for information on what we're offering. Sign up is required, so you'll have to call us!
- The column called Renee's is Reminders. So, did you know the speed limit in the park is 15mph? I know it's difficult to do 15mph, but 50 mph is Mario Andretti. 
